Timeline

The **Illuminati**—(plural of [Latin](#) *illuminatus*, ‘enlightened’) is a name given to several groups, both real and fictitious. Historically, the name usually refers to the **Bavarian Illuminati**, an **Enlightenment-era secret society** founded on 1 May 1776 in [Bavaria](#), today part of [Germany](#). The society’s goals were to oppose [superstition](#), [obscurantism](#), religious influence over public life, and abuses of [state power](#). “The order of the day,” they wrote in their general statutes, “is to put an end to the machinations of the purveyors of injustice, to control them without dominating them.”<sup>[a]</sup> The Illuminati—along with [Freemasonry](#) and other secret societies—were outlawed through [edict](#) by [Charles Theodore, Elector of Bavaria](#), with the encouragement of the [Catholic Church](#), in 1784, 1785, 1787, and 1790.<sup>[a]</sup> During subsequent years, the group was generally vilified by conservative and religious critics who claimed that the Illuminati continued underground and were responsible for the [French Revolution](#). Many influential intellectuals and progressive politicians counted themselves as members, including [Ferdinand of Brunswick](#) and the diplomat [Franz Xaver von Zach](#), who was the Order’s second-in-command.<sup>[a]</sup> It attracted literary men such as [Johann Wolfgang von Goethe](#) and [Johann Gottfried Herder](#) and the reigning [Duke of Gotha](#) and of [Weimar](#).<sup>[a]</sup> In subsequent use, “Illuminati” has referred to various organisations which have claimed, or have been claimed to be, connected to the original Bavarian Illuminati or similar secret societies, though these links have been unsubstantiated. These organisations have often been alleged to conspire to control world affairs, by masterminding events and planting agents in [government](#) and [corporations](#), in order to gain [political power](#) and influence and to establish a [New World Order](#). Central to some of the more widely known and elaborate [conspiracy theories](#), the Illuminati have been depicted as lurking in the shadows and pulling the strings and levers of power in dozens of novels, films, television shows, comics, video games, and music videos.



in der [Geisteswissenschaften](#). *Studienausg.* 1788. The *Owl of Minerva* perched on a book was an emblem used by the Bavarian Illuminati in their “Minerval” degree. [Adam Weishaupt](#) (1748–1830) became professor of [Canon Law](#) and [practical philosophy](#) at the [University of Ingolstadt](#) in 1773. He was the only non-clerical professor at an institution run by [Jesuits](#), whose order Pope [Clement XIV](#) had dissolved in 1773. The Jesuits of Ingolstadt, however, still retained the purse strings and some power at the university, which they continued to regard as their own. They made constant attempts to frustrate and discredit non-clerical staff, especially when course material contained anything they regarded as liberal or Protestant. Weishaupt became deeply [anti-clerical](#), resolving to spread the ideas of the [Enlightenment](#) (*Aufklärung*) through some sort of secret society of like-minded individuals.<sup>[a]</sup> Finding [Freemasonry](#) expensive, and not open to his ideas, he founded his own society which was to have a system of ranks or grades based on those in Freemasonry, but with his own agenda.<sup>[a]</sup> His original name for the new order was *Bund der Perfektibilisten*, or Covenant of Perfectionity (Perfectibilists); he later changed it because it sounded too strange.<sup>[a]</sup> On 1 May 1776, Weishaupt and four students formed the Perfectibilists, taking the *Owl of Minerva* as their symbol.<sup>[a]</sup> The members were to use aliases within the society. Weishaupt became *Spartacus*. Law students Massenhausen, Bauhof, Merz and Sutor became respectively *Ajax*, *Agathon*, *Tiberius* and *Erasmus Roterodamus*. Weishaupt later expelled Sutor for indolence.<sup>[a]</sup> In April 1778, the order became the *Illuminatenorden*, or Order of Illuminati, after Weishaupt had seriously contemplated the name *Bee order*.<sup>[a]</sup>

Massenhausen proved initially the most active in expanding the society. Significantly, while studying in Munich shortly after the formation of the order, he recruited [Javier von Zwack](#), a former pupil of Weishaupt at the beginning of a significant administrative career. (At the time, he was in charge of the Bavarian National Lottery.) Massenhausen’s enthusiasm soon became a liability in the eyes of Weishaupt, often resulting in attempts to recruit unsuitable candidates. Later, his erratic love-life made him neglectful, and as Weishaupt passed control of the Munich group to Zwack, it became clear that Massenhausen had misappropriated subscriptions and intercepted correspondence between Weishaupt and Zwack. In 1778, Massenhausen graduated and took a post outside [Bavaria](#), taking no further interest in the order. At this time, the order had a nominal membership of twelve.<sup>[a]</sup> With the departure of Massenhausen, Zwack immediately applied himself to recruiting more mature and important recruits. Most prized by Weishaupt was Hertel, a childhood friend and a canon of the [Munich Frauenkirche](#). By the end of summer 1778 the order had 27 members (still counting Massenhausen) in 5 commands; Munich (Athens), Ingolstadt (Eleusis), Ravensberg (Sparta), Freysingen (Thebes), and Eichstaedt (Erzurum).<sup>[a]</sup> During this early period, the order had three grades of Novice, Minerval, and Illuminated Minerval, of which only the Minerval grade involved a complicated ceremony. In this the candidate was given secret signs and a password. A system of mutual espionage kept Weishaupt informed of the activities and character of all his members, his favourites becoming members of the ruling council, or Areopagus. Some novices were permitted to recruit, becoming *Insinuants*. Christians of good character were actively sought, with Jews and pagans specifically excluded, along with women, monks, and members of other secret societies. Favoured candidates were rich, docile, willing to learn, and aged 18–30.<sup>[a]</sup>

**Transition** Having, with difficulty, dissuaded some of his members from joining the Freemasons, Weishaupt decided to join the older order to acquire material to expand his own ritual. He was admitted to lodge “Prudence” of the *Rite of Strict Observance* early in February 1777. His progress through the three degrees of “blue lodge” masonry taught him nothing of the higher degrees he sought to exploit, but in the following year a priest called Abbé Marotti informed Zwack that these inner secrets rested on knowledge of the older religion and the primitive church. Zwack persuaded Weishaupt that their own order should enter into friendly relations with Freemasonry, and obtain the dispensation to set up their own lodge. At this stage (December 1778), the addition of the first three degrees of Freemasonry was seen as a secondary project.<sup>[a]</sup> With little difficulty, a warrant was obtained from the *Grand Lodge of Prussia called the Royal York for Friendship*, and the new lodge was called *Theodore of the Good Council*, with the intention of flattering [Charles Theodore, Elector of Bavaria](#). It was founded in Munich on 21 March 1779, and quickly packed with Illuminati. The first master, a man called Radl, was persuaded to return home to Baden, and by July Weishaupt’s order ran the lodge.<sup>[a]</sup> The next step involved independence from their Grand Lodge. By establishing masonic relations with the *Union* lodge in Frankfurt, affiliated to the [Premier Grand Lodge of England](#), lodge Theodore became independently recognised, and able to declare its independence. As a new mother lodge, it could now spawn lodges of its own. The recruiting drive amongst the Frankfurt masons also obtained the allegiance of [Adolph Freiherr Knigge](#).<sup>[a]</sup>



[Adolph Freiherr Knigge](#), the most effective recruiter for the Illuminati Knigge was recruited late in 1780 at a convention of the [Rite of Strict Observance](#) by Costanzo Marchese di Costanzo, an infantry captain in the Bavarian army and a fellow Freemason. Knigge, still in his twenties, had already reached the highest initiatory grades of his order, and had arrived with his own grand plans for its reform. Disappointed that his scheme found no support, Knigge was immediately intrigued when Costanzo informed him that the order that he sought to create already existed. Knigge and three of his friends expressed a strong interest in learning more of this order, and Costanzo showed them material relating to the Minerval grade. The teaching material for the grade was “liberal” literature which was banned in Bavaria, but common knowledge in the Protestant German states. Knigge’s three companions became disillusioned and had no more to do with Costanzo, but Knigge’s persistence was rewarded in November 1780 by a letter from Weishaupt. Knigge’s connections, both within and outside of Freemasonry, made him an ideal recruit. Knigge, for his own part, was flattered by the attention, and drawn towards the order’s stated aims of education and the protection of mankind from despotism. Weishaupt managed to acknowledge, and pledge to support, Knigge’s interest in alchemy and the “higher sciences”. Knigge replied to Weishaupt outlining his plans for the reform of Freemasonry as the Strict Observance began to question its own origins.<sup>[a]</sup>

## Origin of the Illuminati

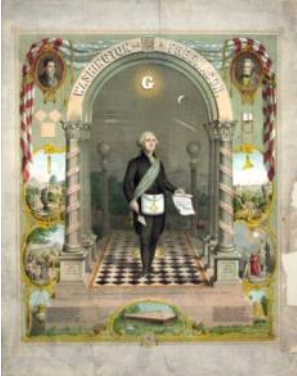
When the [word Illuminati is mentioned](#), there are several things that immediately come to mind; Bilderberg, New World Order, [the Cabal](#), celebrities and politicians to name a few. But, whether or not the Illuminati is a covert organization of reptilians with an esoteric agenda for global domination via subliminal enslavement, or a secret club of elites who throw strange occult parties, it does have a traceable origin similar in nature to the Freemasons.

The Illuminati date back to the mid-1700s, founded by a Bavarian professor at the [University of Ingolstadt](#) named [Adam Weishaupt](#). Weishaupt was a law professor, followed by an even higher honor of Professor of Natural and Canon Law. Unfortunately, he butt ed heads with the Jesuit priests of the University. Weishaupt’s world-views were more cosmopolitan and liberal than the bucolic, dogmatic views of the priesthood. In response, he created the Illuminati, a secret society eponymously promoting enlightenment as well as moral progress. The priesthood, waging significant political power in those days, revoked his academic credentials and had him banished from the country. He moved on to Germany where he was better received and free to form the foundation of the Illuminati and its philosophy. [The mission statement](#) of Weishaupt’s Illuminati was, “by the mutual assistance of its members, to attain the highest possible degree of morality and virtue, and to lay the foundation for the reformation of the world by the association of good men to oppose the progress of moral evil.”

While his ambitions were ostensibly noble, Weishaupt intended to change the way European nations were run, by subversive means. Acceptance requirements to become a member of the Illuminati consisted primarily of wealth, societal influence and political pull. Members of the society consisted of bankers, politicians, doctors and those of general upper-class importance. Thus, planting the seeds for the modern conception or iteration of the Illuminati. One of the original member’s name that is still highly recognized and associated today with the Illuminati was Mayer Amschel Rothschild.

## The Founding Father

The Illuminati was founded by Weishaupt in the year 1776, an obviously significant year in American history. It is pretty commonly known that many of the founding fathers were members of the freemasons. George Washington, Benjamin Franklin and John Hancock were notable masons, and the influence of their membership can be seen in the philosophies they imbued in the Constitution [as well as symbolism in our currency](#). The basic explanation is that they were simply freemasons who kept their philosophies secret because it clashed with church doctrine, but some believe it to be deeper and linked to the Illuminati. The use of the symbolism of the all-seeing eye above a pyramid on the dollar bill is said to have come from Weishaupt. The Latin words encircling the pyramid translate to “it has favored our undertakings, new order of the ages” or some take it to mean “the Announcement of a New World Order.”



## Conspiracy Theories

The Illuminati has become a household term now with its popularization in media and pop culture. Conspiracies range as to the extent of the power of the Illuminati, but most maintain that the group is made up of high-brow politicians, bankers, business moguls and celebrities. On the extreme end of the spectrum, these members are thought to be an [alien reptilian species controlling humanity](#). The most notorious of the clandestine groups associated with the Illuminati is the Bilderberg Group. The Bilderbergers hold a n annual meeting, which is no secret and is ostensibly held to discuss issues pertaining to European and North American relations. [The Bilderberg website](#) states that the meeting is an amalgam of leaders and experts from politics, media and business who are invited to discuss megatrends and major issues facing the world. What makes the meetings mysterious and has led to conspiracies surrounding it, is that they are held under the “Chatham Rule,” meaning the identities of all attendees are kept secret. Conspiracies surrounding the plans hashed out at Bilderberg meetings concern the plotting of a New World Order through methods ranging from population control, to the spread of pandemics, to Chemtrails, geo-engineering, and a [secret space program](#). Other tactics thought to be discussed at these meetings include bribery and compromising of politicians through various means. A major point of contention, for American citizens that are potentially involved in these meetings, is that they are breaking the law through the Logan Act, which prohibits unauthorized citizens from negotiating with foreign governments that have disputes with the U.S. Whether the Illuminati is real or still active is up for debate, but the clandestine Bilderberg meetings will undoubtedly continue to fuel conspiracies. Are they plotting diabolical schemes? And if there’s nothing to hide why is their membership kept so secret?

Knigge replied to Weishaupt outlining his plans for the reform of Freemasonry as the Strict Observance began to question its own origins.<sup>[4]</sup> Weishaupt set Knigge the task of recruiting before he could be admitted to the higher grades of the order. Knigge accepted, on the condition that he be allowed to choose his own recruiting grounds. Many other masons found Knigge's description of the new masonic order attractive, and were enrolled in the Minerval grade of the Illuminati. Knigge appeared at this time to believe in the "Most Serene Superiors" which Weishaupt claimed to serve. His inability to articulate anything about the higher degrees of the order became increasingly embarrassing, but in delaying any help, Weishaupt gave him an extra task. Provided with material by Weishaupt, Knigge now produced pamphlets outlining the activities of the outlawed Jesuits, purporting to show how they continued to thrive and recruit, especially in Bavaria. Meanwhile, Knigge's inability to give his recruits any satisfactory response to questions regarding the higher grades was making his position untenable, and he wrote to Weishaupt to this effect. In January 1781, faced with the prospect of losing Knigge and his masonic recruits, Weishaupt finally confessed that his superiors and the supposed antiquity of the order were fictions, and the higher degrees had yet to be written.<sup>[4]</sup> If Knigge had expected to learn the promised deep secrets of Freemasonry in the higher degrees of the Illuminati, he was surprisingly calm about Weishaupt's revelation. Weishaupt promised Knigge a free hand in the creation of the higher degrees, and also promised to send him his own notes. For his own part, Knigge welcomed the opportunity to use the order as a vehicle for his own ideas. His new approach would, he claimed, make the Illuminati more attractive to prospective members in the Protestant kingdoms of Germany. In November 1781 the Areopagus advanced Knigge 50 florins to travel to Bavaria, which he did via [Swabia](#) and [Franconia](#), meeting and enjoying the hospitality of other Illuminati on his journey.<sup>[4]</sup>

#### Internal problems

The order had now developed profound internal divisions. The Eichstaedt command had formed an autonomous province in July 1780, and a rift was growing between Weishaupt and the Areopagus, who found him stubborn, dictatorial, and inconsistent. Knigge fitted readily into the role of peacemaker.<sup>[4]</sup>

In discussions with the Areopagus and Weishaupt, Knigge identified two areas which were problematic. Weishaupt's emphasis on the recruitment of university students meant that senior positions in the order often had to be filled by young men with little practical experience. Secondly, the anti-Jesuit ethos of the order at its inception had become a general [anti-religious](#) sentiment, which Knigge knew would be a problem in recruiting the senior Freemasons that the order now sought to attract. Knigge felt keenly the stifling grip of conservative Catholicism in Bavaria, and understood the anti-religious feelings that this produced in the liberal Illuminati, but he also saw the negative impression these same feelings would engender in Protestant states, inhibiting the spread of the order in greater Germany. Both the Areopagus and Weishaupt felt powerless to do anything less than give Knigge a free hand. He had the contacts within and outside of Freemasonry that they needed, and he had the skill as a ritualist to build their projected gradal structure, where they had ground to a halt at *Illuminatus Minor*, with only the Minerval grade below and the merest sketches of higher grades. The only restrictions imposed were the need to discuss the inner secrets of the highest grades, and the necessity of submitting his new grades for approval.<sup>[4]</sup> Meanwhile, the scheme to propagate Illuminatism as a legitimate branch of Freemasonry had stalled. While Lodge Theodore was now in their control, a chapter of "Elect Masters" attached to it only had one member from the order, and still had a constitutional superiority to the craft lodge controlled by the Illuminati. The chapter would be difficult to persuade to submit to the Areopagus, and formed a very real barrier to Lodge Theodore becoming the first mother-lodge of a new Illuminated Freemasonry. A treaty of alliance was signed between the order and the chapter, and by the end of January 1781 four daughter lodges had been created, but independence was not in the chapter's agenda.<sup>[4]</sup>

Costanza wrote to the Royal York pointing out the discrepancy between the fees dispatched to their new Grand Lodge and the service they had received in return. The Royal York, unwilling to lose the revenue, offered to confer the "higher" secrets of Freemasonry on a representative that their Munich brethren would dispatch to Berlin. Costanza accordingly set off for Prussia on 4 April 1780, with instructions to negotiate a reduction in Theodore's fees while he was there. On the way, he managed to have an argument with a Frenchman on the subject of a lady with whom they were sharing a carriage. The Frenchman sent a message ahead to the king, some time before they reached Berlin, denouncing Costanza as a spy. He was only freed from prison with the help of the Grand Master of Royal York, and was expelled from [Prussia](#) having accomplished nothing.<sup>[4]</sup>

#### New system

Knigge's initial plan to obtain a constitution from London would, they realised, have been seen through by the chapter. Until such time as they could take over other masonic lodges that their chapter could not control, they were for the moment content to rewrite the three degrees for the lodges which they administered.<sup>[4]</sup>

On 20 January 1782, Knigge tabulated his new system of grades for the order. These were arranged in three classes:

- Class I – The nursery, consisting of the Noviciate, the Minerval, and Illuminatus minor.
- Class II – The Masonic grades. The three "blue lodge" grades of Apprentice, Companion, and Master were separated from the higher "Scottish" grades of Scottish Novice and Scottish Knight.
- Class III – The Mysteries. The lesser mysteries were the grades of Priest and Prince, followed by the greater mysteries in the grades of Mage and King. It is unlikely that the rituals for the greater mysteries were ever written.<sup>[4]</sup>

#### Attempts at expansion

Knigge's recruitment from German Freemasonry was far from random. He targeted the masters and wardens, the men who ran the lodges, and were often able to place the entire lodge at the disposal of the Illuminati. In [Aachen](#), Baron de Witte, master of Constanzy lodge, caused every member to join the order. In this way, the order expanded rapidly in central and southern Germany, and obtained a foothold in Austria. Moving into the Spring of 1782, the handful of students that had started the order had swelled to about 300 members, only 20 of the new recruits being students.<sup>[4]</sup>

In Munich, the first half of 1782 saw huge changes in the government of Lodge Theodore. In February, Weishaupt had offered to split the lodge, with the Illuminati going their own way and the chapter taking any remaining traditionalists into their own continuation of Theodore. At this point, the chapter unexpectedly capitulated, and the Illuminati had complete control of lodge and chapter. In June, both lodge and chapter sent letters severing relations with Royal York, citing their own faithfulness in paying for their recognition, and Royal York's failure to provide any instruction into the higher grades. Their neglect of Costanza, failure to defend him from malicious charges or prevent his expulsion from Prussia, were also cited. They had made no effort to provide Costanza with the promised secrets, and the Munich masons now suspected that their brethren in Berlin relied on the mystical French higher grades which they sought to avoid. Lodge Theodore was now independent.<sup>[4]</sup>

The *Elite of Strict Observance* was now in a critical state. Its nominal leader was Prince Carl of Södermanland (later [Charles XIII of Sweden](#)), openly to absorb the rite into the Swedish Rite, which he already controlled. The German lodges looked for leadership to [Duke Ferdinand of Brunswick-Wolfenbüttel](#). Suspicion turned to open contempt when it transpired that Carl regarded the [Stuart heir](#) to the British throne as the true Grand Master, and the lodges of the Strict Observance all but ignored their Grand Master. This impasse led to the Convent of Wilhelmsbad.<sup>[4]</sup>

#### Convent of Wilhelmsbad



"Ruined" castle built by [Prince Charles of Hesse-Kassel](#) in the park at Wilhelmsbad, venue for the last convent of the Strict Observance. Delayed from 15 October 1781, the last convention of the Strict Observance finally opened on 16 July 1782 in the spa town of Wilhelmsbad on the outskirts of (now part of) [Hanau](#). Ostensibly a discussion of the future of the order, the 35 delegates knew that the Strict Observance in its current form was doomed, and that the Convent of Wilhelmsbad would be a struggle over the pieces between the [German mystics](#), under [Duke Ferdinand of Brunswick-Wolfenbüttel](#) and their host [Prince Charles of Hesse-Kassel](#), and the [Martinists](#), under [Jean-Baptiste Willermoz](#). The only dissenting voices to mystical higher grades were [Johann Joachim Christoph Bode](#), who was horrified by Martinism, but whose proposed alternatives were as yet unformed, and Franz Dietrich von Dittfurth, a judge from [Wetzlar](#) and master of the *Joseph of the Three Helmets* lodge there, who was already a member of the Illuminati. Dittfurth publicly campaigned for a return to the basic three degrees of Freemasonry, which was the least likely outcome of the convention. The mystics already had coherent plans to replace the higher degrees.<sup>[4]</sup>

The lack of a coherent alternative to the two strains of mysticism allowed the Illuminati to present themselves as a credible option. Dittfurth, prompted and assisted by Knigge, who now had full authority to act for the order, became their spokesman. Knigge's original plan to propose an alliance between the two orders was rejected by Weishaupt, who saw no point in an alliance with a dying order. His new plan was to recruit the masons opposed to the "Templar" higher degree of the Strict Observance.<sup>[4]</sup> At the convent, Dittfurth blocked the attempts of Willermoz and Hesse to introduce their own higher grades by insisting that full details of such degrees be revealed to the delegates. The frustration of the German mystics led to their enrolling Count Kollowrat with the Illuminati with a view to later affiliation. Dittfurth's own agenda was to replace all of the higher degrees with a single fourth degree, with no pretensions to further masonic revelations. Finding no support for his plan, he left the convent prematurely, writing to the Areopagus that he expected nothing good of the assembly.<sup>[4]</sup>

In an attempt to satisfy everybody, the Convent of Wilhelmsbad achieved little. They renounced the Templar origins of their ritual, while retaining the Templar titles, trappings and administrative structure. Charles of Hesse and Ferdinand of Brunswick remained at the head of the order, but in practice the lodges were almost independent. The Germans also adopted the name of the French order of Willermoz, les *Chevaliers bienfaisants de la Cité sainte* (Good Knights of the Holy City), and some Martinist mysticism was imported into the first three degrees, which were now the only essential degrees of Freemasonry. Crucially, individual lodges of the order were now allowed to fraternise with lodges of other systems. The new "Scottish Grade" introduced with the Lyon ritual of Willermoz was not compulsory, each province and prefecture was free to decide what, if anything, happened after the three craft degrees. Finally, in an effort to show that something had been achieved, the convent regulated at length on etiquette, titles, and a new numbering for the provinces.<sup>[4]</sup>

#### Aftermath of Wilhelmsbad

What the Convent of Wilhelmsbad actually achieved was the demise of the Strict Observance. It renounced its own origin myth, along with the higher degrees which bound its highest and most influential members. It abolished the strict control which had kept the order united, and alienated many Germans who mistrusted Martinism. Bode, who was repelled by Martinism, immediately entered negotiations with Knigge, and finally joined the Illuminati in January 1783. Charles of Hesse joined the following month.<sup>[4]</sup>

Knigge's first efforts at an alliance with the intact German Grand Lodges failed, but Weishaupt persisted. 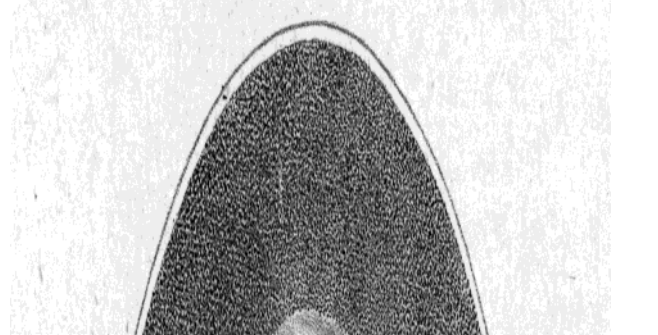

Knigge's first efforts at an alliance with the intact German Grand Lodges failed, but Weishaupt persisted. He proposed a new federation where all of the German lodges would practise an agreed, unified system in the essential three degrees of Freemasonry, and be left to their own devices as to which, if any, system of higher degrees they wished to pursue. This would be a federation of Grand Lodges, and members would be free to visit any of the "blue" lodges, in any jurisdiction. All lodge masters would be elected, and no fees would be paid to any central authority whatsoever. Groups of lodges would be subject to a "Scottish Directorate", composed of members delegated by lodges, to audit finances, settle disputes, and authorise new lodges. These in turn would elect Provincial Directorates, who would elect inspectors, who would elect the national director. This system would correct the current imbalance in German Freemasonry, where masonic ideals of equality were preserved only in the lower three "symbolic" degrees. The various systems of higher degrees were dominated by the elite who could afford researches in [alchemy](#) and mysticism. To Weishaupt and Knigge, the proposed federation was also a vehicle to propagate Illuminism throughout German Freemasonry. Their intention was to use their new federation, with its emphasis on the fundamental degrees, to remove all allegiance to Strict Observance, allowing the "eclectic" system of the Illuminati to take its place.<sup>[a]</sup> The circular announcing the new federation outlined the faults of German freemasonry, that unsuitable men with money were often admitted on the basis of their wealth, that the corruption of civil society had infected the lodges. Having advocated the deregulation of the higher grades of the German lodges, the Illuminati now announced their own, from their "unknown Superiors". Lodge Theodore, newly independent from Royal York, set themselves up as a provincial Grand Lodge. Knigge, in a letter to all the Royal York lodges, now accused that Grand Lodge of decadence. Their Freemasonry had allegedly been corrupted by the Jesuits. Strict Observance was now attacked as a creation of the Stuarts, devoid of all moral virtue. The Zinnendorf rite of the [Grand Landlodge of the Freemasons of Germany](#) was suspect because its author was in league with the Swedes. This direct attack had the opposite effect to that intended by Weishaupt, it offended many of its readers. The Grand Lodge of the Grand Orient of Warsaw, which controlled Freemasonry in Poland and Lithuania, was happy to participate in the federation only as far as the first three degrees. Their insistence on independence had kept them from the Strict Observance, and would now keep them from the Illuminati, whose plan to annex Freemasonry rested on their own higher degrees. By the end of January 1783 the Illuminati's masonic contingent had seven lodges.<sup>[a]</sup> It was not only the clumsy appeal of the Illuminati that left the federation short of members. Lodge Theodore was recently formed and did not command respect like the older lodges. Most of all, the Freemasons most likely to be attracted to the federation saw the Illuminati as an ally against the mystics and [Martinists](#), but valued their own freedom too highly to be caught in another restrictive organisation. Even Difturh, the supposed representative of the Illuminati at Wilhelmsbad, had pursued his own agenda at the convent.<sup>[a]</sup> The non-mystical Frankfurt lodges created an "Eclectic Alliance", which was almost indistinguishable in constitution and aims from the Illuminati's federation. Far from seeing this as a threat, after some discussion the Illuminati lodges joined the new alliance. Three Illuminati now sat on the committee charged with writing the new masonic statutes. Aside from strengthening relations between their three lodges, the Illuminati seem to have gained no advantage from this manoeuvre. Difturh, having found a masonic organisation that worked towards his own ambitions for Freemasonry, took little interest in the Illuminati after his adherence to the Eclectic Alliance. In reality, the creation of the Eclectic Alliance had undermined all of the subtle plans of the Illuminati to spread their own doctrine through Freemasonry.<sup>[a]</sup>

**Zenith**

Although their hopes of mass recruitment through Freemasonry had been frustrated, the Illuminati continued to recruit well at an individual level. In Bavaria, the succession of [Charles Theodore](#) initially led to a liberalisation of attitudes and laws, but the clergy and courtiers, guarding their own power and privilege, persuaded the weak-willed monarch to reverse his reforms, and Bavaria's repression of liberal thought returned. This reversal led to a general resentment of the monarch and the church among the educated classes, which provided a perfect recruiting ground for the Illuminati. A number of Freemasons from *Prudence* lodge, disaffected by the Martinist rites of the *Chevaliers Bienfaisants*, joined lodge Theodore, who set themselves up in a gardened mansion which contained their library of liberal literature.<sup>[a]</sup> Illuminati circles in the rest of Germany expanded. While some had only modest gains, the circle in [Mainz](#) almost doubled from 31 to 61 members. Reaction to state Catholicism led to gains in Austria, and footholds were obtained in [Warsaw](#), [Pressburg](#) (Bratislava), [Tyrol](#), [Milan](#) and [Switzerland](#).<sup>[a]</sup> The total number of verifiable members at the end of 1784 is around 650. Weishaupt and Hertel later claimed a figure of 2,500. The higher figure is largely explained by the inclusion of members of masonic lodges that the Illuminati claimed to control, but it is likely that the names of all the Illuminati are not known, and the true figure lies somewhere between 650 and 2,500. The importance of the order lay in its successful recruitment of the professional classes, churchmen, academics, doctors and lawyers, and its more recent acquisition of powerful benefactors. [Karl August, Grand Duke of Saxe-Weimar-Eisenach](#), [Ernest II, Duke of Saxe-Gotha-Altenburg](#) with his brother and later successor [August, Karl Theodor Anton Maria von Dalberg](#) governor of [Erfurt](#), [Duke Ferdinand of Brunswick-Wolfenbüttel](#) (already mentioned), his chief assistant in masonic matters, [Johann Friedrich von Schwarz](#), and Count [Metternich of Koblenz](#) were all enrolled. In Vienna, Count [Brigido](#), governor of Galicia, Count [Leopold Kolowrat](#), chancellor of [Bohemia](#) with his vice-Chancellor Baron Kressel, Count [Pálffy von Erdöd](#), chancellor of Hungary, Count [Banffy](#), governor and provincial Grand Master of Transylvania, Count [Stadion](#), ambassador to London, and Baron von Swieten, minister of public education, also joined.<sup>[a]</sup>

There were notable failures. [Johann Kaspar Lavater](#), the Swiss poet and theologian, rebuffed Knigge. He did not believe the order's humanitarian and rationalist aims were achievable by secret means. He further believed that a society's drive for members would ultimately submerge its founding ideals. [Christoph Friedrich Nicolai](#), the Berlin writer and bookseller, became disillusioned after joining. He found its aims chimeric, and thought that the use of Jesuit methods to achieve their aims was dangerous. He remained in the order, but took no part in recruitment.<sup>[a]</sup>

**Conflict with Rosicrucians**

At all costs, Weishaupt wished to keep the existence of the order secret from the [Rosicrucians](#), who already had a considerable foothold in German Freemasonry. While clearly [Protestant](#), the Rosicrucians were anything but anticlerical, were pro-monarchy, and held views clearly conflicting with the Illuminati vision of a rationalist state run by philosophers and scientists. The Rosicrucians were not above promoting their own brand of mysticism with fraudulent seances. A conflict became inevitable as the existence of the Illuminati became more evident, and as prominent Rosicrucians, and mystics with Rosicrucian sympathies, were actively recruited by Knigge and other over-enthusiastic helpers. [Kolowrat](#) was already a high ranking Rosicrucian, and the mystic [Prince Charles of Hesse-Kassel](#) had a very low opinion of the rationalist higher grades of the Illuminati.<sup>[a]</sup> The Prussian Rosicrucians, under [Johann Christoph von Wöllner](#), began a sustained attack on the Illuminati. Wöllner had a specially engineered room in which he convinced potential patrons of the effectiveness of Rosicrucian "magic", and his order had acquired effective control of the ["Three Globes"](#), and its attached lodges. Through this mouthpiece, the Illuminati were accused of [atheism](#) and revolutionary tendencies. In April 1783, [Frederick the Great](#) informed Charles of Hesse that the Berlin lodges had documents belonging to the Minervals or Illuminati which contained appalling material, and asked if he had heard of them. All Berlin masons were now warned against the order, which was now accused of [Socinianism](#), and of using the liberal writings of Voltaire and others, alongside the tolerance of Freemasonry, to undermine all religion. In November 1783, the Three Globes described the Illuminati as a masonic sect which sought to undermine Christianity and turn Freemasonry into a political system. Their final anathema, in November 1784, refused to recognise any Illuminati as Freemasons.<sup>[a]</sup> In Austria, the Illuminati were blamed for anti-religious pamphlets that had recently appeared. The Rosicrucians spied on [Joseph von Sonnenfels](#) and other suspected Illuminati, and their campaign of denunciation within Freemasonry completely shut down Illuminati recruitment in Tyrol.<sup>[a]</sup> The Bavarian Illuminati, whose existence was already known to the Rosicrucians from an informant, were further betrayed by the reckless actions of Ferdinand Maria Baader, an Areopagite who now joined the Rosicrucians. Shortly after his admission it was made known to his superiors that he was one of the Illuminati, and he was informed that he could not be a member of both organisations. His letter of resignation stated that the Rosicrucians did not possess secret knowledge, and ignored the truly Illuminati, specifically identifying Lodge Theodore as an Illuminati Lodge.<sup>[a]</sup>

**Internal dissent**

As the Illuminati embraced Freemasonry and expanded outside Bavaria, the council of the Areopagites was replaced by an ineffective "Council of Provincials". The Areopagites, however, remained as powerful voices within the Order, and began again to bicker with Weishaupt as soon as Knigge left Munich. Weishaupt responded by privately slandering his perceived enemies in letters to his perceived friends.<sup>[a]</sup> More seriously, Weishaupt succeeded in alienating Knigge. Weishaupt had ceded considerable power to Knigge in deputising him to write the ritual, power he now sought to regain. Knigge had elevated the Order from a tiny anti-clerical club to a large organisation, and felt that his work was under-acknowledged. Weishaupt's continuing anti-clericalism clashed with Knigge's mysticism, and recruitment of mystically inclined Freemasons was a cause of friction with Weishaupt and other senior Illuminati, such as Difturh. Matters came to a head over the grade of Priest. The consensus among many of the Illuminati was that the ritual was florid and ill-conceived, and the regalia puerile and expensive. Some refused to use it, others edited it. Weishaupt demanded that Knigge rewrite the ritual. Knigge pointed out that it was already circulated, with Weishaupt's blessing, as ancient. This fell on deaf ears. Weishaupt now claimed to other Illuminati that the Priest ritual was flawed because Knigge had invented it. Offended, Knigge now threatened to tell the world how much of the Illuminati ritual he had made up. Knigge's attempt to create a convention of the Areopagites proved fruitless, as most of them trusted him even less than they trusted Weishaupt. In July 1784 Knigge left the order by agreement, under which he returned all relevant papers, and Weishaupt published a retraction of all slanders against him.<sup>[a]</sup> In forcing Knigge out, Weishaupt deprived the order of its best theoretician, recruiter, and apologist.<sup>[a]</sup>

**Decline**

The final decline of the Illuminati was brought about by the indiscretions of their own Minervals in Bavaria, and especially in Munich. In spite of efforts by their superiors to curb loose talk, politically dangerous boasts of power and criticism of monarchy caused the "secret" order's existence to become common knowledge, along with the names of many important members. The presence of Illuminati in positions of power now led to some public disquiet. There were Illuminati in many civic and state governing bodies. In spite of their small number, there were claims that success in a legal dispute depended on the litigant's standing with the order. The Illuminati were blamed for several anti-religious publications then appearing in Bavaria. Much of this criticism sprang from vindictiveness and jealousy, but it is clear that many Illuminati court officials gave preferential treatment to their brethren. In Bavaria, the energy of their two members of the Ecclesiastical Council had one of them elected treasurer. Their opposition to [Jesuits](#) resulted in the banned order losing key academic and church positions. In Ingolstadt, the Jesuit heads of department were replaced by Illuminati.<sup>[a]</sup> Alarmed, [Charles Theodore](#) and his government banned all [secret societies](#) including the Illuminati.<sup>[a]</sup> A government edict dated 2 March 1785 "seems to have been deathblow to the Illuminati in Bavaria". Weishaupt had fled and documents and internal correspondence, seized in 1786 and 1787, were subsequently published by the government in 1787.<sup>[a]</sup> Von Zwack's home was searched and much of the group's literature was disclosed.<sup>[a]</sup>

The early days of Illuminati were basically a bunch of nerdy Dungeons and Dragons kids with a *Dead Poets Society* complex who really wanted to grow up and become Scientologists.

Without much of an original plan other than sheer frustration with his own powerlessness, Weishaupt looked to the Freemasons as inspiration for his mega-cool secret brotherhood (no women, Jews, or Pagans allowed). The Freemasons were a Western fraternal network that preached morality through symbolic rituals and initiations into three different degrees of Masonry. Weishaupt envied Freemasonry's organization and power but basically wanted his own version of freethinkers. So he joined the Freemasons to covertly study its structure, all the while

The Order of the **Illuminati** was an **Enlightenment**-age secret society founded by university professor **Adam Weishaupt** on 1 May 1776, in **Upper Bavaria**, Germany. The movement consisted of advocates of **freethought**, **secularism**, **liberalism**, **republicanism**, and **gender equality**, recruited from the German **Masonic Lodges**, who sought to teach **rationalism** through **mystery schools**. In 1785, the order was infiltrated, broken up and suppressed by the government agents of **Charles Theodore, Elector of Bavaria**, in his preemptive campaign to neutralize the threat of secret societies ever becoming hotbeds of conspiracies to overthrow the Bavarian **monarchy** and its **state religion**, Roman Catholicism.<sup>[a]</sup> There is no evidence that the Bavarian Illuminati survived its suppression in 1785.<sup>[a]</sup>

In the late 18th century, **reactionary** conspiracy theorists, such as Scottish physicist **John Robison** and French **Jesuit** priest **Augustin Barruel**, began speculating that the Illuminati had survived their suppression and become the masterminds behind the **French Revolution** and the **Reign of Terror**. The Illuminati were accused of being **subversives** who were attempting to secretly orchestrate a **revolutionary wave** in **Europe** and the rest of the world in order to spread the most **radical** ideas and movements of the Enlightenment—**anti-clericalism**, **anti-monarchism**, and **anti-patriarchalism**—and to create a world **noocracy** and **cult of reason**. During the 19th century, fear of an Illuminati conspiracy was a real concern of the European **ruling classes**, and their oppressive reactions to this unfounded fear provoked in 1848 **the very revolutions they sought to prevent**.<sup>[a]</sup>

During the **interwar period** of the 20th century, **fascist** propagandists, such as British revisionist historian **Nesta Helen Webster** and American socialite **Edith Starr Miller**, not only popularized the myth of an Illuminati conspiracy but claimed that it was a subversive secret society which served the Jewish elites that supposedly propped up both **finance capitalism** and **Soviet communism** in order to **divide and rule** the world. American evangelist **Gerald Burton Winrod** and other conspiracy theorists within the **fundamentalist Christian** movement in the United States—which emerged in the 1910s as a backlash against the principles of Enlightenment **secular humanism**, **modernism**, and liberalism—became the main channel of dissemination of Illuminati conspiracy theories in the U.S.. **Right-wing populists**, such as members of the **John Birch Society**, subsequently began speculating that some collegiate fraternities (**Skull and Bones**), gentlemen's clubs (**Bohemian Club**), and think tanks (**Council on Foreign Relations**, **Trilateral Commission**) of the **American upper class** are **front organizations** of the Illuminati, which they accuse of plotting to create a New World Order through a one-world government.<sup>[a]</sup>

### Early illuminati

According to adherents, the source of the “light” was viewed as being directly communicated from a higher source or due to a clarified and exalted condition of the **human intelligence**. To the former class belong the **Alumbrados** (Spanish: “enlightened”) of **Spain**. Spanish historian **Marcelino Menéndez y Pelayo** first finds the name about 1492 (in the form *aluminados*, 1498) but traces them back to a **gnostic** origin and thinks their views were promoted in Spain through influences from **Italy**. One of their earliest leaders—indeed, some scholars style her as a “pre-Alumbrado”—was María de Santo Domingo, who came to be known as La Beata de Piedrahita. She was a labourer’s daughter, born in Aldeanueva, south of **Salamanca**, about 1485. She joined the **Dominican** order as a teenager and soon achieved renown as a prophet and mystic who could converse directly with **Jesus Christ** and the **Virgin**. **Ferdinand of Aragon** invited her to his court, and he became convinced of the sincerity of her visions. The Dominicans appealed to Pope **Julius II** for guidance, and a series of trials were **convened** under the **auspices** of the **Inquisition**. Her patrons, which by then included not only Ferdinand but also **Francisco Cardenal Jiménez de Cisneros** and the **duke of Alba**, ensured that no decision was taken against her, and she was cleared in 1510.

**St. Ignatius of Loyola**, while studying at Salamanca (1527), was brought before an **ecclesiastical** commission on a charge of sympathy with the Alumbrados, but he escaped with an **admonition**. Others were not so fortunate. In 1529 a congregation of unlettered adherents at **Salamanca** was visited with **excommunication** and imprisonment. Greater rigour followed, and for about a

recruiting more Illuminati.

Weishaupt enlisted early Illuminati member Xavier von Zwack to establish a strong membership base in Munich. Zwack was able to pull a few influential members who weren’t all trust fund college kids. Besides that whole no-women-or-Jews thing, ideal candidates were “rich, docile, willing to learn, and aged 18–30.”

When the Illuminati had gathered more members, Weishaupt applied for a separate lodge under the Freemason umbrella. He called the new lodge *Theodore of the Good Council*, intending to flatter **Charles Theodore, Elector of Bavaria**, and invited all his Illuminati recruits to join. Shady af.

In 1780, the Illuminati recruited the man who would become its most influential member, Adolph Knigge. Still in his twenties, Knigge had achieved the highest level of the Freemason order but became frustrated by the lack of growth potential. By this time, the Illuminati had established three of its own grades: Novice, Minerval, and Illuminated Minerval, with Weishaupt touting the highest level’s “extensive” initiations. Knigge was intrigued and quickly reached the Minerval level by studying the required liberal literature, which was banned in Bavaria, and recruiting more members. Soon, he’d completed all the levels Weishaupt had created. In an attempt to buy time, Weishaupt brainstormed what came next. Knigge called his bluff, then proposed some ideas of his own. Knigge first suggested filling more senior positions within the Illuminati group, as most were still occupied by immature students. Then he massaged the group’s messaging, which had turned anti-religious by this point and served to detract some members. On January 20, 1782, he revised the system of Illuminati orders:

- Class I — The nursery (the Noviciate, the Minerval, and Illuminatus minor)
- Class II — The Masonic grades (“blue lodge” grades of Apprentice, Companion, and Master; and higher “Scottish” grades of Scottish Novice and Scottish Knight)
- Class III — The Mysteries (lesser grades of Priest and Prince; higher grades of Mage and King)

By the spring of 1782, the Illuminati had reached 300 members under Knigge’s influence.

Meanwhile, through a series of ugly restructurings, Lodge Theodore found itself wholly independent from the Freemasons, meaning the Illuminati had freedom to pursue whatever weird initiation rituals they saw fit. (Most of the early years seemed more like an administrative comedy of errors than actual work, kind of like *The Office*.) Politically frustrated Freemasons defected for the Illuminati and its more “eclectic” approach, apparently devoid of power structures like Martinism. By January 1773, the group had seven lodges across Germany. By 1784, total Illuminati membership numbered between 650 and 2,500 (such is the inexact arithmetic of secret societies).

Once it recruited a bunch of influential scholars and benefactors, word spread of the Illuminati’s growing reputation. As a result, competing brotherhoods used their own baller members to warn against its liberal agenda. Then Weishaupt and Knigge had a falling out over the Priest ritual— *yada yada yada*—Knigge resigned, members got sloppy, and news of the “secret” order became common knowledge. Shockingly, it turned out some of the order’s most influential members held public office. In a fit of rage against the group that was so thirsty to please him, Charles Theodore outlawed all secret societies by March 1785, under penalty of death.

The movement (under the name of *Illuminés*) seems to have reached [France](#) from [Seville](#) in 1623. It attained some prominence in [Picardy](#) when joined (1634) by Pierre Guérin, curé of Saint-Georges de Roye, whose followers, known as Guérinets, were suppressed in 1635. Another body of *Illuminés* surfaced in the south of France in 1722 and appears to have lingered till 1794, having [affinities](#) with those known contemporaneously as “French Prophets,” an offshoot of the [Protestant](#) militant [Camisards](#).

Of a different class were the [Rosicrucians](#), who claimed to have originated in 1422 but achieved public notice in 1537. Their teachings combined something of Egyptian [Hermetism](#), Christian gnosticism, Jewish [Kabbala](#), [alchemy](#), and a variety of other [occult](#) beliefs and practices. The earliest [extant](#) writing which mentions the Rosicrucian order was the *Fama Fraternitatis*, first published in 1614 but probably circulated in manuscript form somewhat earlier than this. It recounts the journey of the reputed founder of the movement, [Christian Rosenkreuz](#), to [Damascus](#), Damcar (a legendary hidden city in Arabia), [Egypt](#), and [Fès](#), where he was well received and came into possession of much secret wisdom. He returned finally to [Germany](#), where he chose three others to whom he imparted this wisdom and thus founded the order. Later the number was increased to eight, who separated, each going to a separate country. One of the six articles of agreement they adopted was that the fraternity should remain secret for 100 years. At the end of 120 years the secret burial place and the perfectly preserved body of the founder were discovered by one of the then members of the order, along with certain documents and symbols held in very high esteem by Rosicrucians. The sacred vault was re-covered, the members of the order dispersed, and the location of the vault was lost to history. The *Fama* ends with an invitation to “some few” to join the fraternity. Among those believed to have been associated with the order were German alchemist [Michael Maier](#), British physician [Robert Fludd](#), and British philosopher and statesman [Sir Francis Bacon](#).



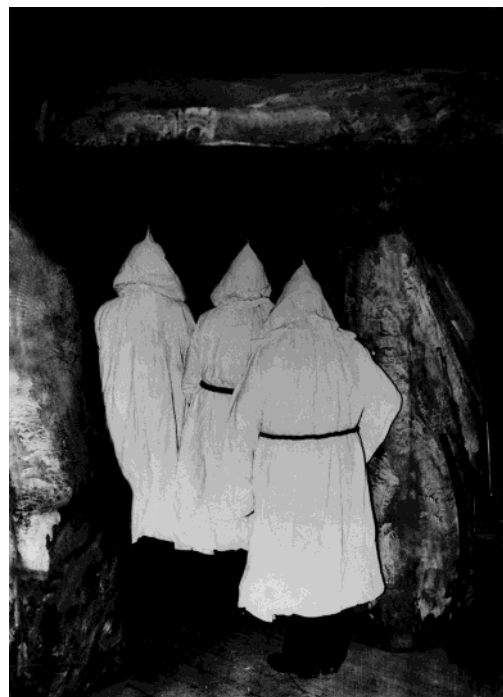

After some quiet years, author John Robinson released *Proofs of a Conspiracy* in 1797, an anti-Freemasonry book that accused such societies of continuing to influence a New World Order. Spinoff books and theories circulated into the 20th century, demonizing the Illuminati as a sinister, pagan cult when in fact its origins amounted to nothing more than a dried up German circle jerk.

Still, concerns over the Illuminati remained relatively quiet until the mid-1980s. Then, Paul Haggis released his 1985 book

## The **Bavarian illuminati**

Perhaps the group most closely associated with the name *illuminati* was a short-lived movement of **republican** free thought founded on **May Day** 1776 by Adam Weishaupt, professor of **canon law** at **Ingolstadt** and a former **Jesuit**. The members of this **secret society** called themselves "Perfectibilists." Their founder's aim was to replace **Christianity** with a religion of **reason**, as later did the **revolutionaries of France** and the 19th-century positivist philosopher **Auguste Comte**. The order was organized along Jesuit lines and kept internal **discipline** and a system of mutual surveillance based on that model. Its members pledged obedience to their superiors and were divided into three main classes: the first included "novices," "minervals," and "lesser illuminati"; the second consisted of freemasons ("ordinary," "Scottish," and "Scottish knights"); and the third or "mystery" class **comprised** two grades of "priest" and "regent" as well as "magus" and "king." Beginning with a narrow circle of **disciples** carefully selected from among his own students, Weishaupt gradually extended his recruitment efforts from Ingolstadt to Eichstätt, **Freising**, **Munich**, and elsewhere, with special attention being given to the enlistment of young men of wealth, rank, and social importance. From 1778 onward Weishaupt's illuminati began to make contact with various **Masonic** lodges, where, under the impulse of **Adolf Franz Friedrich, Freiherr von Knigge**, one of their chief converts, they often managed to gain a commanding position. It was to Knigge that the society was indebted for the extremely elaborate constitution (never, however, actually realized) as well as its internal communication system. Each member of the order had given him a special name, generally **classical**, by which he alone was addressed in official writing (Weishaupt was referred to as **Spartacus** while Knigge was **Philo**). All internal correspondence was conducted in **cipher**, and to increase the mystification, towns and provinces were invested with new and altogether arbitrary **designations**. At its period of greatest development, Weishaupt's "Bavarian Illuminati" included in its operations a very wide area, extending from **Italy** to **Denmark** and from **Warsaw** to **Paris**; at no time, however, do its numbers appear to have exceeded 2,000. The order and its doctrines appealed to literary giants such as **Johann Wolfgang von Goethe** and **Johann Gottfried von Herder** as well as the dukes Ernest II of Gotha and **Charles Augustus** of **Saxe-Weimar-Eisenach**. Such notables were claimed as members although it is questionable if they were actually so. Weishaupt's illuminati were believed to have included astronomer **Johann Bode**, writer and bookseller **Friedrich Nicolai**, philosopher **Friedrich Jacobi**, and poet **Friedrich Leopold, Graf zu Stolberg-Stolberg**.

Secret societies of this kind fitted in with the idea of **benevolent despotism** as a vehicle for the **Enlightenment**, as Goethe shows in *Wilhelm Meister's Apprenticeship*. The movement suffered from internal dissension and was ultimately banned by an edict of the **Bavarian government** in 1785. Some members were imprisoned, while others were driven from their homes. Weishaupt was stripped of his chair at Ingolstadt and banished from Bavaria. After 1785 the historical record contains no further activities of Weishaupt's illuminati, but the order figured prominently in **conspiracy theories** for centuries after its disbanding. It was credited with activities ranging from the instigation of the **French Revolution** to the **assassination of U.S. Pres. John F. Kennedy**, and the notion of an all-knowing **cabal** of ancient masters remained a powerful image in

origins amounted to nothing more than a dried up German circle jerk.

Still, concerns over the Illuminati remained relatively quiet until the mid-1990s. Then Prodigy released his 1995 remix of LL Cool J's "I Shot Ya." He raps: "Illuminati want my mind, soul, and my body / Secret society trying to keep they eye on me." Over the next few years, hip hop artists like AZ, the Wu-Tang Clan, and Dr. Dre coincidentally(?) invoked either the Illuminati or the New World Order. According to a **Daily Beast** breakdown, rapper Canibus' 1998 single "Channel Zero" claims the government and astronomer Carl Sagan communicate with aliens, which also explains Roswell, duh. Armchair conspiracy theorists seized the opportunity to demonize successful black artists. Entertainers like Jay Z *must* have sold their souls to the devil if they're rapping about it...And while we're at it, so did Rihanna, Kanye, LeBron James, and Barack Obama.

The popularity of conspiracy books like *Angels and Demons*, coupled with 9/11 truthers and the growth of the web only fanned the crazy flames. Whenever a celebrity wears a triangle pattern, truthers accuse them of referencing the eye on the back of a dollar bill, and its Masonic origins. If **Beyoncé likes goats**, she obviously worships Baphomet, a pagan **deity**. And she probably put these **goats in these trees**, too.

- The modern conspiracy theories surrounding the illuminati were first popularized by Robert Wilson and Kerry Thornley through fictional works and fake letters to magazines in the 1960s.
- The group most closely associated with the name "illuminati" was formed in Bavaria in 1776 by Adam Weishaupt, who wanted an alternative to the Freemasons for intellectuals and influential figures.
- The organization was banned in 1785, and during enforcement of the ban, authorities found documents that defended suicide and atheism, as well as instructions for abortions.

**Later illuminati**

After the suppression of Weishaupt’s order, the title *illuminati* was given to the French Martinists, founded in 1754 by Martinez Pasqualis and [propagated](#) by [Louis-Claude de Saint-Martin](#). By 1790 Martinism had been spread to [Russia](#) by Johann Georg Schwarz and [Nikolay Novikov](#). Both strains of “illuminated” Martinism included elements of Kabbalism and Christian mysticism, imbibing ideas from [Jakob Böhme](#) and [Emanuel Swedenborg](#).

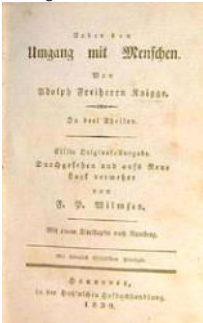

# Adolph Knigge

**Freiherr** Adolph Franz Friedrich Ludwig Knigge (16 October 1752 – 6 May 1796) was a [German](#) writer, [Freemason](#), and a leading member of the Order of the [Illuminati](#).

Knigge was born in Bredenbeck (now a part of [Wennigsen](#), [Lower Saxony](#)) in the [Electorate of Hanover](#) as a member of the lesser nobility. When he was barely eleven, his mother died, and when his father died three years later the teenager inherited a large debt. His creditors took possession of the family property and assigned the boy a meagre pension of 500 thalers.<sup>[1]</sup> He studied law from 1769 to 1772 in [Göttingen](#) where he became a member of Corps Hannovera. He was allegedly [initiated](#) into Freemasonry in 1772 in [Kassel](#), where he held a position as Court Squire (*hofjunker*) and Assessor of the War and Domains Exchequer. In 1777 he became Chamberlain at the [Weimar](#) court. In 1780 Knigge joined [Adam Weishaupt's Bavarian Illuminati](#) and his work with the Illuminati gave the group a great deal of publicity and influence of Masonic [chapters](#).<sup>[2]</sup> But in 1783 dissensions arose between Knigge and Weishaupt, which resulted in Knigge's final withdrawal from the group on 1 July 1784. Knigge stated that he could no longer endure Weishaupt's pedantic domineering, which frequently assumed offensive forms. He accused Weishaupt of "Jesuitism", and suspected him of being "a Jesuit in disguise" (Nachtr., I, 129). "And was I", he adds, "to labour under his banner for mankind, to lead men under the yoke of so stiff-necked a fellow?—Never!" Knigge's involvement with the Illuminati, support of the advancement of [human rights](#), and a period of serious illness led to the loss of support of his aristocratic sponsors and finally his fortune. Knigge found a measure of financial stability again with a position in [Bremen](#) in 1790. He died in Bremen in 1796. In [Germany](#), Knigge is best remembered for his book *Über den Umgang mit Menschen* (*On Human Relations*), a treatise on the fundamental principles of human relations that has the reputation of being the authoritative guide to behaviour, politeness, and etiquette. The work is more of a sociological and philosophical treatise on the basis of human relations than a how-to guide on etiquette, but the German word "Knigge" has come to mean "good manners" or books on etiquette.

## The Illuminati Conspiracy Theory

Someone who is a proponent of the Illuminati conspiracy theory believes that there is an elite and secret organization called the "Illuminati" who is seeking to create a dominant world totalitarian government (Bergara & Medej, 2016). This "New World Order," so named, involves a single government (made up of Illuminati members) that would rule over the entire planet. According to a survey done about the Illuminati, 23% of Americans believe in the Illuminati and New World Order (Bergara & Medej, 2016).

There also seems to be a link with conservative beliefs, as many conservatives are unhappy with the amount of involvement of the government in private affairs. There are many different theories as to who runs the illuminati, but the general consensus is that celebrities and government officials alike are part of it. Information about the illuminati is heavily prevalent on the conspiracy theories section of Youtube, in documentaries, and on websites such as [www.illuminatiofficial.org](#). This theory enjoys popularity today, as most people are somewhat aware of the Illuminati, even if they don't believe in it. This theory is extraordinary because its claims are extraordinary—they go against everything we know about our world currently. As far as we are taught, different countries have different governments, and America especially has safeguards against authoritarianism. The idea that there is a group who will control everything defies the Founding Fathers' wishes of freedom for citizens—what our country is founded on.

There are many different forms of evidence that people use to justify the existence of the Illuminati. For instance, there are certain symbols such as the Eye of Horus and pyramid (both on US currency), and when people see this in popular media, they believe it is evidence for that company/organization's involvement in the Illuminati (Hahn, 2018). Another reason people believe that the Illuminati exists is because it did exist in the past (Santoro, 2018). It was created by Weishaupt in Germany, who wanted to have a group where people could have discussions about secularism (Bergara & Medej, 2016). However, during this time period, the Illuminati was about anti-religiosity and free thought. But many people believe that when the Church shut down Weishaupt's group, it continued underground and exists today under the New World Order plan. Another piece of evidence that supporters use is that cops have become more heavily armed than ever, which is indicative of the government militarizing the police (Santoro, 2018). Under a New World Order, we would have to have a strong police force to control citizens. Finally, there are many claims that the Illuminati is "killing celebrities and replacing them with clones" in an attempt to brainwash society (Bergara & Medej, 2016). These claims are backed up by video footage showing certain celebrities looking confused or staring off into space, to suggest that they are "glitching". For example, there are clips of Beyonce, Eminem, and Al Roker staring off into space or freezing for prolonged periods of time in news clips (Bergara & Medej, 2016).

There is also a laundry list of evidence that questions the existence of the Illuminati. For one, there is not conclusive evidence that definitely shows that the Illuminati exists (Hahn, 2018). Much of the evidence touted for the Illuminati relies on theories made by proponents, or video clips interpreted by proponents. However, there isn't a way to test that the Illuminati exists, because it is impossible to prove that it doesn't exist (since it is supposedly a "secret society"). Additionally, many people have questioned why a society that is supposed to be so secretive would put out so many "hints" that they exist for followers to interpret (Hahn, 2018). If the society was real, and their primary goal was to hide their existence, it would make more sense for them to erase any videos or online content discussing the Illuminati, and not show for proof to the world (currently there are thousands of Illuminati conspiracy videos on Youtube). Finally, there is the point that in our capitalist society, the ability to make money by any means necessary is very important. Skeptics point out that if people put occult or illuminati symbolism in their content, it will help them gain popularity because people love to talk about conspiracies (Hahn, 2018). If influencers are purposefully including this material in their content, it would falsify at least some of the claims of the "proof" of the illuminati.

There are two major cognitive contributions that are influential in people's propensities to believe in the illuminati—confirmation bias, and the error of logic discussed in FiLCHers. For confirmation bias, much of the proof that is used to verify the existence of the illuminati is popular culture—videos, news, celebrity behavior, etc. When people see these ambiguous sources of information, they will often find a way to construe the evidence in a way that supports their belief. For example, there was a clip of Beyonce at a basketball game where she was zoned out for 30 minutes and moving her head from side to side. This video was used as proof that celebrities are killed and then replaced with clones that sometimes "glitch". This was an ambiguous source—Beyonce could have simply been zoned out and moving her head because her eyes were tracking the movement of the game of basketball she was watching. However, illuminati conspiracists interpreted this video to mean that Beyonce is a part of the illuminati and she was glitching. When every piece of ambiguous information shown to you is interpreted by you to be evidence for the illuminati, this reaffirms the strength of the belief you hold. In the lines of the example discussed, these conspiracists would be ignoring all of the times Beyonce was behaving "normally" because it didn't fit into their narrative. Another cognitive contribution is the issue of logic. Ryan Bergara and Shane Medej (2016) interviewed a professor of conspiracy theories who discussed how many illuminati supporters use a "trail of evidence" to support their beliefs. They start in small steps where their logic sounds rational, and then suddenly make a crazy leap to where their evidence starts to sound irrational (Bergara & Medej, 2016). This fits into an issue with logic because while the premises may be true, the conclusions do not follow from the premises. For example, they may start by discussing how the government is overly involved in people's lives (rational, especially after the Patriot Act) and then make the jump that all of government is made up of lizard people that control the world. I believe that those who believe the theory are misinformed because they believe that there are these complex meaningful patterns in randomness (apophenia), and it is easy to fall into this level of mistakenness when the information starts small as a "foot in the door" and spirals into these huge unbelievable conspiracy theories.

I wouldn't say there is one specific community that illuminati believers come from, but there are certainly characteristics that are common between subsets of the population. One characteristic is conservative beliefs. As mentioned above, the illuminati and conservatives share the critical belief that the government is heavily involved in the lives of its citizens. Many of the current Illuminati theorists are right wing, including Mark Koernke, David Icke, Pat Robertson, and Donald Marshall (Bergara & Medej, 2016). Another characteristic that stems from right-wing extremism is anti-Semitism. The Illuminati conspiracy is inherently anti-Semitic because a large part of the population of believers think that Jews control the world (similar to the propaganda touted during Nazi Germany). To believe that any one group controls the world is in line with the idea of the illuminati and the New World Order. Finally, I would say that generally, Illuminati proponents are people that have a great deal of cynicism and mistrust of the world around them. To believe in conspiracies is to believe that what you see around you is not objective reality, but rather a reality created to somehow dupe you. The social influences that help sustain their beliefs involve a sense of community. When you have

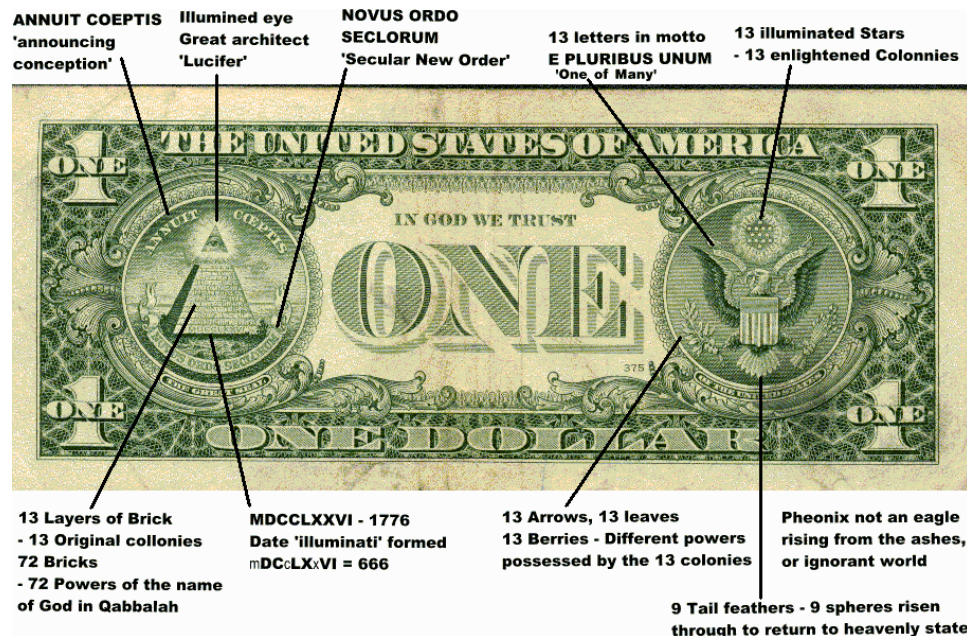
Whether you believe in the Illuminati or not, you cannot deny that it is one of the most popular conspiracies out there currently. The problem with this belief is that it reifies stereotypical beliefs of Jews controlling the world, and it creates a sense of fear and panic in society to propose that we will all be controlled in an authoritarian government some day. The psychological explanations for the belief system, including confirmation bias, logic errors, stereotype heuristics, and herd mentality help to create a more holistic view of this conspiracy theory. By understanding why people have this belief and how it is maintained psychologically, we can attempt to educate the world to think more critically about unverified conspiracy theories, as well as analyze the world around us in a more scientific way.

# Martinism

**Martinism** is a form of [Christian mysticism](#) and [esoteric Christianity](#) concerned with the fall of the first man, his state of material privation from his divine source, and the process of his return, called 'Reintegration' or illumination.

As a mystical tradition, it was first transmitted through a Masonic high-degree system established around 1740 in France by [Martinez de Pasqually](#), and later propagated in different forms by his two students [Louis Claude de Saint-Martin](#) and [Jean-Baptiste Willermoz](#).

The term *Martinism* applies to both this particular doctrine and the teachings of the reorganized "Martinist Order" founded in 1886 by [Augustin Chaboseau](#) and [Gérard Encausse](#) (aka [Papus](#)). It was not used at the tradition's inception in the 18th century. This confusing disambiguation has been a problem since the late 18th century, where the term *Martinism* was already used interchangeably between the teachings of [Louis-Claude de Saint-Martin](#) and [Martinez de Pasqually](#), and the works of the first being attributed to the latter.<sup>[1]</sup> Regular transmission of Martinism to Augustin Chaboseau and Gérard Encausse has yet to be documented.

## Martinist History

### Louis Claude de Saint-Martin

The writings of Louis Claude de Saint-Martin and Martinès de Pasqually form the foundations of the Martinist Teachings. The story of these two great mystics begins in the early eighteenth century. In the midst of the great political and economic unrest leading to the French Revolution, France paused to listen to a debonair, inspiring, mysterious man who awed both the nobility and the people with the high level of mysticism contained in his published writings. This author signed his books "The Unknown Philosopher." Where did his great understanding come from? He could have been easily mistaken for a Sophist, yet he possessed the gentleness and profound understanding of a philanthropist.



This person was Louis Claude de Saint-Martin. He dared to invade the salons of the wealthy aristocrats to challenge their jaded interests with inspiring discourses. He allowed himself to become the idol of French society with but one purpose—to draw their minds away from their meaningless, self-indulgent existence to contemplate humanity's true position in the universe. He wished them to comprehend the natural connection existing between the Divine, humanity, and the universe, and to be conscious of the special place we once occupied in our original state and what happened to us during the course of time. Above all, he wanted them to learn how to regain this glorious former state.

The published writings of Louis Claude de Saint-Martin were read in France, Germany, England, and even in Russia. The knowledge that he imparted became known under the name of Martinism. This great teacher refused to take credit for what he taught, however, instead paying tribute to his initiators. To those who were worthy, he divulged the secret of a higher knowledge they could access. To attain it, they had to transform themselves, and their preparation was through initiation.

### Martinès de Pasqually

The person to whom Louis Claude de Saint-Martin gave credit for his teachings was Martinès de Pasqually, a powerful mystic, adept, and theurgist of the eighteenth century. Tradition indicates he was well versed in the secret wisdom embodied in the esoteric teachings of Egypt, Greece, and the East. Shortly after 1760, Pasqually went to Bordeaux and established the headquarters for his order, The Masonic Élus-Cohen Knights of the Universe.

Saint-Martin, then an officer in the French Army, learned that one of his fellow officers was a member of this Order of the Élus-Cohens (Elect Priests). Through this friend, Saint-Martin met with the Supreme Master of the Order, Martinès de Pasqually, and was immediately captivated by the man's goals and teachings.

After due preparation and demonstration of his worthiness, Saint-Martin was initiated into the Order of the Élus-Cohens in the year 1765, at age 22. He eventually attained the highest degree of that Order, that of Réau - Croix. However, Saint-Martin was not entirely won over by Pasqually's methods, which called for theurgic rites, complicated ceremonies concerned with perceivable manifestations. Saint-Martin often asked Pasqually, "Master, is all that necessary in order to know the Divine?"

In 1772, personal matters compelled Pasqually to leave France for Port-au-Prince, Haiti, where he died in 1774. Without its founder, the Order progressively fell dormant. His two ablest disciples were Saint-Martin and Jean-Baptiste Willermoz. Willermoz joined with some members of the Élus-Cohens and the Order of the Strict German Templar Observance. They reorganized themselves by adopting part of the theoretical teachings of Martinès de Pasqually to create an order called "The Charitable Knights of the Holy City." Others joined this Order, but Saint-Martin, seeing that they were not so much seeking the truth as the Philosopher's Stone, chose to follow an independent path.

### Jakob Boehme

Saint-Martin traveled to England, Italy, and Germany to study humanity and nature and to compare the findings of others with his own. It was in Strasbourg, a city in northeast France, that he became acquainted with the works of Jakob Boehme (1575–1624), which revolutionized his whole mystical life. Jakob Boehme became for Saint-Martin his "second teacher."

*In order to read Boehme's texts in their original language, Saint-Martin learned German at the age of forty-five. Through a study of Boehme, he realized that true initiation surpasses theurgic rituals; there is no need to call upon intermediary powers of creation through complex and often dangerous ceremonies. Initiation can only be produced with the heart. This is what is called "The Way of the Heart."*

From this point until the end of his life, Saint-Martin made a daily task of translating the texts of Jakob Boehme. "I owe my entry into the higher truths to Martinès de Pasqually, and I owe the most important steps I have made into these truths to Jakob Boehme."

## The Writings of Louis Claude de Saint-Martin

Saint-Martin published his first work in 1775 under the title *Of Errors and Of Truth*, or *Humanity Recalled to the Universal Principle of Science*. The book's purpose was to combat the atheism of his time. As with all his other writings, this was published under the pseudonym of "The Unknown Philosopher."

During the many years of his literary activity, Louis Claude de Saint-Martin wrote numerous works, including *The Natural View of the Connections Existing Between the Divine, Humanity, and the Universe*; *The Person of Desire*; *The New Person*; *The Spirit of Things*; and *The Ministry of the Human-Spirit*. He also left to posterity a revealing and inspiring personal correspondence, as well as a few posthumous works. In addition, he published translations of the writings of the one he called his "most dear B" (Jakob Boehme): *The Birth of Dawn*; *The Three Principles of the Divine Essence*; *Forty Questions on the Soul*; *The Triple Life of Humanity*; and *Six Points and Nine Texts*.

## Society of Intimates

The philosophical works of Louis Claude de Saint-Martin aroused much interest. In order to study his teachings, a circle of disciples was formed, known by the name of Society of Intimates. This society was working for the purest forms of spirituality. Saint-Martin accepted very few men and women into his society, always exercising extreme prudence.

Despite the political and social turbulence of the French Revolution, Louis Claude de Saint-Martin was never seriously harassed during the Reign of Terror, or at any other time during the Revolution. On October 13, 1803, at the age of sixty, Louis Claude de Saint-Martin went through transition following a stroke.



Following Louis Claude de Saint-Martin's death, the Martinist disciples were not very active. The traditional teachings and ceremonies were privately transmitted by groups of initiators, spreading principally throughout Italy, Germany, and France.

## The Martinist Order

After a long period of secrecy, a great effort was undertaken in 1888 to restructure Martinism into an initiatic order. It is due to the efforts of Dr. Gérard Encausse (Papus) and Augustin Chaboseau that this order survived and took on the name Martinist Order. Their efforts were rewarded with success in 1891 with the formation of a Supreme Council of the Martinist Order, consisting of twenty-one members with authority over all the lodges in the world. Papus, a well-known French esotericist, was elected the first President of the Supreme Council. Under his brilliant and tireless direction, the Order grew rapidly, and by 1900, it could account for several hundred members in most parts of the world.

*Papus soon became an authority on Martinism, and his works constitute a precious source of information for Martinists and all those interested in the tradition.*

World War I (1914–1918) greatly affected the growth and activities of the Order. Papus died heroically carrying out his duties as a medical doctor, and many other leaders and members of the Order did not survive. It was finally revived in 1931 due to the efforts of Augustin Chaboseau, the co-founder of the Martinist Order with Papus. He, along with the two other remaining survivors of the 1891 Supreme Council, created the Traditional Martinist Order to distinguish it from several movements which wrongly claimed to be the successors of Papus. Augustin Chaboseau, who was a descendant of an uninterrupted filiation back to Louis Claude de Saint-Martin, served as Grand Master and President of the Supreme Council until his transition on January 2, 1946.

## The Traditional Martinist Order

Ralph Maxwell Lewis, Emperor of the Ancient and Mystical Order Rosae Crucis, was received into the Traditional Martinist Order on September 1, 1939. His Initiator was Georges Lagrèze, legate and representative of Augustin Chaboseau. Consequently, the charters, manifestos, and all other documents needed for the promotion and development of Martinism in the Americas were transmitted to Ralph M. Lewis just prior to the oppression which the Traditional Martinist Order had to endure in Europe during the Second World War.

Currently, the Supreme Council of the Traditional Martinist Order is directed and presided over by the Sovereign Grand Master, Claudio Mazzucco, Emperor of the Rosicrucian Order, AMORC. The Traditional Martinist Order goes back through an initiatic transmission that is absolutely authentic, to the purest sources of Martinism. Thus, the Martinist light has been able to shine and spread, without interruption, its original luster.

## Obscurantism

**Obscurantism** and **Obscuranism** (/ˈɒbˈʃkɪərənˈtzəm, əb-/ or /ˈɒbʃkɪəˈræntzəm/)<sup>[a]</sup> describe the practice of deliberately presenting information in an imprecise, **abstruse** manner designed to limit further inquiry and understanding.<sup>[a]</sup> There are two historical and intellectual denotations of *Obscurantism*: (1) the deliberate restriction of knowledge—opposition to disseminating **knowledge**;<sup>[a]</sup> and (2) deliberate obscurity—a **recondite literary** or artistic style, characterized by deliberate vagueness.<sup>[a][b]</sup>

The term *obscurantism* derives from the title of the 16th-century satire *Epistolæ Obscurorum Virorum* (*Letters of Obscure Men*, 1515–19), that was based upon the **intellectual** dispute between the German humanist **Johann Reuchlin** and the monk **Johannes Pfefferkorn** of the **Dominican Order**, about whether or not all **Jewish** books should be **burned** as un-Christian heresy.<sup>[c][d][e]</sup> Earlier, in 1509, the monk Pfefferkorn had obtained permission from **Maximilian I, Holy Roman Emperor** (1486–1519), to burn all copies of the **Talmud** (**Jewish law** and **Jewish ethics**) known to be in the **Holy Roman Empire** (AD 926–1806); the *Letters of Obscure Men* satirized the Dominican arguments for burning "un-Christian" works. In the 18th century, **Enlightenment** philosophers applied the term *obscurantist* to any enemy of intellectual enlightenment and the liberal diffusion of knowledge. In the 19th century, in distinguishing the varieties of obscurantism found in **metaphysics** and **theology** from the "more subtle" obscurantism of the **critical philosophy** of **Immanuel Kant**, and of modern **philosophical skepticism**, **Friedrich Nietzsche** said: "The essential element in the black art of obscurantism is not that it wants to darken individual understanding, but that it wants to blacken our picture of the world, and darken our idea of existence."<sup>[a]</sup>

## Obscurantism & The Language of Excess

**Siobhan Lyons** tries not to use either to explain what and why they are.

As a schoolgirl in a Catholic Primary School, I often had to attend church. In W. Somerset Maugham's *Of Human Bondage*, the protagonist Philip Carey assumes that the greater one suffers with discomfort in prayer, the more in favour one will be with God. This would explain not only the religious habit of self-flagellation, but also why church pews are notoriously uncomfortable. Attending an academic conference recently, I was confronted with similar discomfort in the lecture hall, whose seats remarkably resembled church pews in both look and feel. The speaker, although he may have been discussing something of interest, nonetheless appeared to me as a priest whose words echoed in a tone mundane to the point that any interest was obliterated. As with my early days in church, there was a distinct theme of reverence floating through the room, but distastefully; an empty reverence forthought that tends to cannibalise itself in vicious scholarly circles. Students are the members of this church, while the priests are the exalted lecturers who pontificate theories that often have no bearing on reality in any coherent, concrete sense. And these clerics deal in a language marked by *obscurantism* – the darkening or purposeful withholding of knowledge, or communicating in a purposefully complicated manner – as have many philosophers historically. So, although Marx criticised German Idealism for being obscure, Marx himself has continuously been accused of writing obscurely; as have Kant, Hegel, Wittgenstein, Heidegger, and perhaps most notoriously, Derrida.

### The Uses of Obscurity

Politically speaking, various philosophers have linked obscurantism with the ability to govern a society. This link is first famously described in *The Republic* (c.380 BC), in which Plato advocates what he calls the 'Noble Lie', a falsehood fed into society for the greater good. Friedrich Nietzsche was more critical of obscurity and obscurantists, arguing, "The essential element in the black art of obscurantism is not that it wants to darken individual understanding, but that it wants to blacken our picture of the world, and darken our idea of existence." (*Human, All Too Human*, p.220, 1878). Yet while Nietzsche saw obscurantism as something that thwarted 'the enlightenment of the mind' (p.121), he nevertheless saw some merit in it, claiming, "sometimes, however, it employs the opposite means and seeks through the highest refinement of the intellect to induce a satiation with its fruits" (*Ibid*). Nietzsche called this 'refined obscurantism' and ascribed it to Immanuel Kant's notoriously difficult writing, praising the author's obscurity for its potential ability to "open a path for faith by showing knowledge its limitations" – a crucial element in the philosophy of obscurantism. Obscurantism can also perhaps be considered a unique kind of art form that shows the absurdity of language. In a journal entry, Ludwig Wittgenstein wrote, "Language is a part of our organism and no less complicated than it," and in his complex work *Tractatus Logico-Philosophicus* (1921), the philosopher writes, somewhat ironically and in a similar vein to Nietzsche, "The aim of the book is to set a limit to thought, or rather – not to thought, but to the expression of thoughts: for in order to be able to set a limit to thought, we should have to find both sides of the limit thinkable (i.e., we should have to be able to think what cannot be thought). It will therefore only be in language that the limit can be set, and what lies on the other side of the limit will simply be nonsense" (p.3). One can imagine language as a steady incline along which expressions are uttered, until we reach a point at which expression falls over the edge and becomes nonsensical. It should be remembered that 'nonsense writing' – in Lewis Carroll's *Alice in Wonderland* and *Jabberwocky*, and in the works of Franz Kafka, James Joyce and Flann O'Brien, for instance – has proven creative and enjoyable. But in cases where there is no irony, as opposed to being creative the nonsense becomes, as Wittgenstein puts it, *unhelpful*; and there is a very fine line between creative nonsense and obscure monologue that purports to express sense – as Robert Frost articulates, "Forgive me my nonsense, as I also forgive the nonsense of those that think they talk sense" (*The Letters of Robert Frost*, Volume 1, p.325). We could say that obscurity and nonsense must be for the sake of obscurity and nonsense rather than for the sake of explanation. Or, philosophy must employ language clearly, since it is about communication and explanation, although the language of literature may be used more freely and creatively.

### Creative Obscurity

There is an evident difference between intellectual obscurity and obscure creativity. One can be linguistically creative without resorting to obscurity, or can indeed be obscure in such a way as to be humorous or compelling. Many authors, from Vladimir Nabokov to Roland Barthes, have produced prose that is at once accessible and creative, and whose obscurity can be considered an art form. Experimenting with language in supposedly obscure ways can make literature-as-art (rather than literature-as-communication) emerge victorious. For instance, we witness Nabokov's lyrical prowess throughout *Lolita* (1955), beginning with the slightly unsettling and enigmatic opening sentence, "Lo-lee-ta: the tip of the tongue taking a trip of three steps down the palate to tap, at three, on the teeth." The mastery of such enigmatic sentences is that they often evade the analytical grasp of philosophy or other academia instead becoming art through creative obscurity.

Obscurantism can indeed be an effective manoeuvre, provoking greater thought-processes and intellectual investigation. This couldn't be illustrated more clearly than in Rembrandt's *The Holy Family with a Curtain* (1646). I am less concerned with the religious meanings of this painting than I am about the curtain itself; a seemingly innocuous, pointless part of the work, and yet it provokes the viewer to wonder what lies behind it. The curtain, blood red and purposefully pulled partly to the side, teases the viewer, offering not even a partial glimpse of what it completely obscures. The Virgin is plainly seen; and there is Joseph, semi-obscured in the background, near the curtain; but whatever is behind the curtain itself is left unanswered. The painting thus features three forms of creative depiction: the Virgin's clear visibility, Joseph's semi-obscured form, and the curtain itself, a symbol of obscurantism, or rather, of the ability of obscurity to be creative, by emphasising the ambiguity that so often confronts us, which may however be the source of great art, and indeed philosophy. For the greatest philosophies are aware of their own limits – aware of when they cannot answer the questions their philosophers ask. As Wittgenstein stated, language must be beset by certain limits.

So obscurity in language can be seen as not always self-defeating, but, ironically, as sometimes illuminating. Moreover, if language were a purely functional tool for communication, we would cease to have literature as we understand it. If all curtains in all art were pulled completely aside to expose what lies behind them, then the need for imagination would deteriorate. This also explains why good writers are those who not only have a masterful grasp of language, but who also know how to pull it apart and put it back together in different ways. To an extent, literature is masquerade, something to be deciphered. There is indeed an art to the unsolvable enigma.

### The Obscurity Industry

However, as the science fiction writer Orson Scott Card remarked, "a great many writers and critics have based their entire careers on the premise that anything that the general public can understand without mediation is worthless drivel" (*Ender's Game*, Introduction, p.xix, 1991). In particular the academic industry, which thrives on difficult thinking, and is built on values of linguistic and

intellectual exclusivity, has as a result become insulated, to the extent that many intellectuals reserves their complex speech acts for their peers. Many scholarly journals request that papers should have no 'jargon-laden language', yet these journals still invariably circulate primarily amongst academics. The papers are then cited by other academics in their own papers, leading to the intellectual recycling circle. What good ideas there certainly are in academia, are more often than not reserved for a crowd of academic insiders whose interests lie with an appearance of intellectualism rather than a desire to extend knowledge to others outside of this circle. Many aspects of academia are like an Orwellian conspiracy that operates with its own brand of Newspeak. I have seen presentations at academic conferences which use more straightforward language disregarded in favour of those that use purposefully obscure language. This is indicative of a culture that depends on intellectual reputation. As Terrance Macmullan astutely observed in *The Daily Show and Philosophy* (ed. Jason Holt, 2009):

"Most intellectuals simply don't bother trying to engage the public. This started in large part with the radicalisation of American universities in the 1960s, which led many intellectuals to write off non-intellectuals as dupes, and many non-intellectuals to dismiss academia as a hotbed of leftist propaganda... The isolation of intellectuals became more extreme when they started emulating European theorists, such as Jacques Derrida, who used extremely dense and jargon-laden language. Perhaps academics speak mostly to each other because they think other academics are the only people who can keep up with them intellectually. I suspect, however, that this isolation is largely self-imposed, for the sake of convenience, since it's much easier and more comfortable to speak to someone who shares your assumptions and uses your terms than someone who might challenge your assumptions in unexpected ways or ask you to explain what you mean" (p.61).

Academia seems unable to produce an adequate cultural mediator. Often we have to choose between the obscure theories of a philosopher talking only to academics, or their severely commercialised counterparts in Oprah and Bono etc, preaching to the world a message that risks being distorted and trivialised. But we have come to rely on celebrities to bring certain issues to the world's attention, since the academics, with all their intelligence and innovative ideas, simply do not involve the public in their debates, at least in an efficient manner. It seems to be assumed by swathes of academics that the most complex writing is the most intellectual, but the very concept of communication defies this assumption: successful communication is based on mutual understanding between sender and receiver. But certain writers and academics have interpreted the struggle for clarity as a chore that will potentially make their work dull and uninteresting. And regardless of whether or not listeners, readers and critics actually understand the complex arguments and prose, it is certain that many are too intellectually diffident or pious to challenge the obscure ideas they are listening to or reading, believing that if they can't understand it then it must be beyond their intellectual capacity, and thus of great philosophical value. Yet often all that is being witnessed is pontification masquerading as knowledge and innovation.

Although many students I know swear they love her work, and that they understand her theories, the notoriously complex theorist Judith Butler is an example of obscurantism. As David Gauntlett writes, Butler's "prose is unnecessarily dense and long-winded, and almost never fails to use jargon even where much more accessible vocabulary is available. Some people defend this saying that academics should be allowed to develop complex terminology to express their sophisticated ideas... However, although Butler's writing is like an explosion in a dictionary factory, if one takes the time to dig through the rubble, one finds that her ideas are actually quite straightforward." (*Media, Gender and Identity*, p.146, 2002).

## Language's 'Golden Mean(ing)'

Often it has been said that language is the instrument of philosophy, but it may be more accurate to say that language is the burden of philosophy. Somewhere in the history of philosophy the poor writing style of certain clever philosophers was falsely interpreted by aspiring philosophers as implying a need to be purposefully obscure. So they were.

This shift in communication has operated in the only way Western society understands: through extremes. We replace one ideology or trend with its extreme opposite. In place of anorexia, we have obesity, and vice versa. We've also developed an inadequate system of communication determined by what Aristotle called vices of excess and deficiency. This tendency towards harmful extremes is only remedied by finding what Aristotle called the 'golden mean' between excess and deficiency. But writers often fail to find this golden mean between creativity and obscurity, instead adhering to either excessive complexity or empty simplicity. This culture of extremes believes that 'involving the public' must automatically mean allowing people to communicate incessantly in a constant streaming of voices with no critique as to the quality of ideas involved.

To combat both exclusion and over-inclusion, then, we should be encouraging the proliferation of ideas in public without opening the floodgates of incessant shallow opinion. As Deleuze and Guattari noted in their book *What is Philosophy?* (1994), "we do not lack communication. On the contrary, we have too much of it. We lack creation. We lack resistance to the present. The creation of concepts in itself calls for a future form, for a new earth and people that do not yet exist" (p.108). Yet such desires to accommodate both communication and restraint lead to criteria of taste or class that do not easily allow more intriguing, contradictory figures to emerge: the popular-culture philosopher, the charismatic intellectual, and the Nobel Laureate as a *Playboy* centrefold. Because we live in a culture of extremes, we cannot abide those whose tastes conflate ideas seen to be incompatible: popularity and intellectualism, critical interrogation and low-brow art, wisdom and foolishness – the kinds of contradictions perhaps epitomised in the philosophy of Slavoj Žižek, whose work seems to reconcile the feud between complexity and 'obscene' popular culture. Yet he is, lamentably, one of only few.

I recently overheard a student mistaking 'Rhodes Scholars' for 'rogue scholars', but I thought the mistake fortunate, since it made me think that rather than searching for and recruiting Rhodes Scholars, we should be perhaps searching for Rogue Scholars whose use of language is not reserved for certain groups and lecture theatres. Lecture theatres are spaces of performance; but a performance for the same audience every week; and so they are in reality, spaces of institutionalisation, for education has become more about uniformity and replication than creativity and experimentation. Yet great thinking and writing relies on rogue experimentation.

In academia an excess of language is deemed reputable and sophisticated, while a deficiency of language – the illiterate, the mute, or the nonsensical babbler – is dismissed. Academic language lacks the substantial influence of an Aristotelian 'golden mean'. Yet there is as big a difference between obscure language (mis)communicating good ideas and good language communicating obscure ideas as there is between demolishing language and using language to demolish.
